WHY DO AN INTERNSHIP?

- GAIN PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE IN YOUR FIELD OF INTEREST
- CLARIFY YOUR CAREER GOALS
- EARN ACADEMIC CREDIT
- BUILD A NETWORK IN YOUR FIELD
- ACHIEVE AN ADVANTAGE IN A COMPETITIVE JOB MARKET



The National Society for Experiential Education defines an internship as “A carefully monitored work or volunteer experience in which an individual has intentional learning goals and reflects actively on what he or she is learning through the experience”.

An internship is an educational experience which provides the opportunity to apply classroom learning to the workplace. An internship is supervised, emphasizing learning and professional development, provides a system for feedback and communication and can be either paid or unpaid.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

This is a 3 credit course offered during the fall, spring and summer semesters. Students must complete a minimum of 100 hours (120 in summer) at their internship over 12-15 weeks during the semester. In addition to the practical experience, students are required to attend 7 one hour classes (3 in summer) dealing with topics related to experiential learning and professional development and complete assignments outlined in the syllabus. Students may earn either General Education Elective credit or students majoring in Childhood Studies, English, History, Foreign Language, Nat. Security Minor, Political Science, Sociology, Theater Arts and Urban Studies may be eligible to earn elective credit in their major.

QUALIFICATION

To be eligible for the Arts & Sciences Internship course, a student must be a matriculated student in the College of Arts & Science with sophomore, junior, or senior status or a post-baccalaureate student. Participating students must have at least a 2.5 GPA.

SECURE AN INTERNSHIP

Students are encouraged to meet with the Internship course instructors to discuss internship ideas and to develop an individual internship search strategy. The Career Center provides a list of available internship through the **RaptorLink** on-line database. The office will also assist students with resume writing and interviewing skills. **Internships must be secured by the first internship class meeting.**

HAVE YOUR INTERNSHIP APPROVED

Once you have secured an internship, the internship instructor at the Career Center must approve your internship. Pick up an Internship Approval Form at the Career Center and have it completed by your internship supervisor. When you return your Approval Form to the Career Center, you will be issued a special permission number for the Course.

REGISTER & ATTEND CLASS

Register for the Arts & Sciences Internship course and attend the required classes.



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
